CAP COM CARES FOUNDATION EXTENDS PLEDGE TO THE VANDERHYDEN CAREER CENTER/THRIFT SHOPPE BY \$50.000

Since 2018 CAP COM has supported the Vanderheyden Career Center with \$100,000

Wynantskill, NY – In 2018 we began an endeavor of educating and training **Vanderheyden** individuals for their future career. As we have explored greater ways in which to accomplish our mission, an immense demand was discovered. We found it was vital to develop a Career Center in a supportive learning environment. All too often our population of students and individuals are left unemployed. Not because they are unable to work, but because they lack the skills, confidence, and knowledge about the workplace and their own capabilities. From the beginning CAP COM was there to support our Career Center with a \$100,000 pledge over a five-year period. That pledge was completed in March. We are thrilled to announce that CAP COM has extended that pledge to another \$50,000 over the next two years.

Our latest undertaking is our retail program that is supported at the Career Center through instruction for students on the cleaning, sorting, pricing and preparation of clothes we procure for sale at **The Vandy Thrift Shoppe located at 412 Broadway, Albany NY 12207.** We have been fortunate to receive donations from individuals, organizations and companies over the years which included clothing, shoes, toys/games, household items, etc. As these donations continued to increase, we recognized this as an opportunity to open a thrift store that would benefit the community and our vocational programs for the individuals we serve.

The Richard A. Desrochers Educational Center at Vanderheyden is a Regents accredited 7-12 grade program. It provides education to individuals who are at risk of not succeeding at school, and those in need of a special education. Vanderheyden is a designated Children and Family Treatment and Support Services Provider (CFTSS). The agency is committed to a family focused, trauma informed and community-based system of care.
